


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MAP of South Carolina, showing 1,000 Miles of proposed National Highways. These highways will directly serve 1,050,775 inhabitants of the counties through which they pass, which is 69% of the total population of the State. Abutting counties have a population of 444,029, which is 29% of the total State population—being a total of 1,494,804 inhabitants, equal to 99% served and abutting on these proposed National Highways. The total road mileage in the State is 32,075, so that 3.12% in National Highway mileage will serve directly or abutting 99% of the people.
