Monday, February 7th.

FORENOON.—Lansdowne, Montreal, Park and Tuque Bleue Toboggan Slides opened to all. Inaugural of Lumbermen's and Hunters' Camp, Victoria Square. Inaugural of Maze, Place d'Armes.

AFTERNOON.—Opening of Grand Carnival Toboggan Slide, Jacques-Cartier Square, extending from Nelson's Monument half-a-mile across the River St. Lawrence. Band at Victoria Skating Rink and 5 o'clock Tea.

EVENING.—Inaugural of Ice Castle, Electric Illumination and Grand Pyrotechnic display. Crystal Rink, Fancy Dress Carnival. Band at Victoria Skating Rink and Hockey Match. All Toboggan Slides illuminated and open.

Tuesday, February 8th.

FORENOON.—All Toboggan Slides open to visitors.

AFTERNOON.—Commencement Grand Carnival Races, Point St. Charles Race Course.

EVENING.—All Toboggan Slides illuminated and open to visitors. Victoria Skating Rink, Grand Fancy Dress Carnival. Crystal Rink, Skating Races for 1, 3 and 5 mile championship.

Wednesday, February 9th.

FORENOON.—All Toboggan Slides open. Victoria Rink, Championship Fancy Skating Tournament.

AFTERNOON.—Carnival Snowshoe Races, Shamrock Lacrosse Grounds, 2 o'clock. Continuation Races, Point St. Charles Race Course. Toboggan Races, Park Slide. Contractors' Club Drive to St. Vincent de Paul. Band at Victoria Rink and 5 o'clock Tea.


EVENING.—Snowshoers' attack on Ice Castle and defence. Grand Pyrotechnic display on capitulation. Torchlight Procession of Snowshoers to Mount Royal Park. Crystal Rink, Dancing Competition on Skates.

Thursday, February 10th.

FORENOON.—Drill Hall Rink, Grand Hockey Tournament. Band at Victoria Rink.

AFTERNOON.—Drill Hall Rink, continuation Grand Hockey Tournament. Point St. Charles Race Course, continuation Races; Carnival Gold Medal competed for. Grand Sleigh Parade, introducing a team of Esquimaux dogs and driver. Masquers will participate.

EVENING.—Victoria Rink, Grand Fancy Dress Carnival, introducing novel electric effects. Crystal Rink, Skating Races. Drill Hall Rink, Skating Races and Games.



Friday, February 11th.

FORENOON.—Band at Victoria Rink. Drill Hall Rink, Grand Hockey Tournament.

AFTERNOON.—Drill Hall Rink, Grand Hockey Tournament.

EVENING.—Grand Ball (not Fancy Dress) Windsor Hotel. Victoria Rink, Annual Races and Games. Crystal Rink, Hockey and Polo. Drill Hall Rink, Fancy Dress Carnival.

Saturday, February 12th.

FORENOON.—Drill Hall Rink, Grand Hockey Tournament.

AFTERNOON.—Tandem Club's Drive, starting from Dominion Square. Montreal Snowshoe Club's Annual Races, 2.30 o'clock. Band at Victoria Rink and 5 o'clock Tea. Drill Hall Rink, Grand Tournament.

EVENING.—Drill Hall Rink, Grand Hockey Tournament. Annual Dinner and presentation of prizes, Montreal Snowshoe Club, Windsor Hotel. Crystal Rink, Fancy Dress Carnival. Grand Pyrotechnic display, Ice Castle.

The foregoing Programme is subject to revision and addition. Specially reduced rates prevail on all the railroads leading to Montreal for three weeks from January 31st, giving visitors an opportunity of going to the city for the week before and the week after Carnival.

Lists of hotels, restaurants, boarding and lodging houses are distributed at railroad offices, and may be had on application at Carnival Office, 89 St. Francois Xavier Street.

Special membership tickets, (Gentlemen, \$3.00, Ladies, \$2.00) good for all entertainments Carnival Week, will be issued to strangers by the Victoria Skating Club. Holders of these tickets are cordially invited to take part in Fancy Dress Festivals—subject to costume regulations of the Board.

The electric illumination will be supplied by the Royal Electric Company.

Messrs. Wm. Notman & Son, with the co-operation of the various athletic clubs, will publish combination photographs of the principal events of the Carnival.

Mr. J. H. Kimball, Point St. Charles Race Course, will furnish information necessary in entering for races.

During an afternoon of Carnival Week an Old Folkes' Concert will be given, presenting scores of antique costumes and old English music.

During the Week, the Caledonian, Montreal and Thistle Curling Rinks will be open to curlers and all interested in curling.

Among the objects of interest, open to all during the Carnival, are the superb clubhouse, kennels and stables of the Montreal Hunt Club; the new and spacious Athletic Club-House, Côte des Neiges; the Redpath and Natural History Museums, and several of the most beautiful conservatories in the city.

St. Peter's Cathedral, Dominion Square, in construction, will be open to visitors.

All the drives, Mount Royal Park, will be in excellent order during Carnival week, affording the famous views of Montreal and its environs.
